## April - Spring Clean Up!

It's Spring! Oh my it's been a long winter. Just like the rest of the house, we need to touch up our sewing room with a cleaning.

First of all, clean your machine, take off the throat plate and remove those dust bunnies. Then oil the spots that are called for in the sewing manual. Yep, if you have three machines, do all three. Replace the needles and cutter blades in the serger too!

Vacuuming all that dust from our textiles, machines, and room is ever so nice. The curtains in my room also needed some dust removal, too. And I must say it does smell better.

Don't forget your cutting mat! If you use a self-healing cutting mat, give it a good clean. The best thing to do is get them cleaned and moisturized (sounds like skin). The experts say to soak the mat in water, vinegar (½ cup for every gallon), and a small bit of gentle soap (Palmolive or Ivory) for a short time, maybe 15- 20 minutes. ( I used my tub to do this). Then take a softer brush and get all those extra threads, ink, glue off. Rinse off with clear water and lay flat to dry. I layed a towel on the floor, then the mat, then another towel. The mat looked much better.

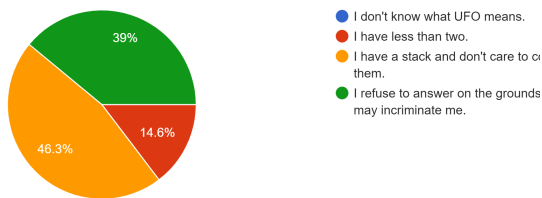
## Quilting Resource Survey

And according to this "data" most of us don't care to count our UFO's.

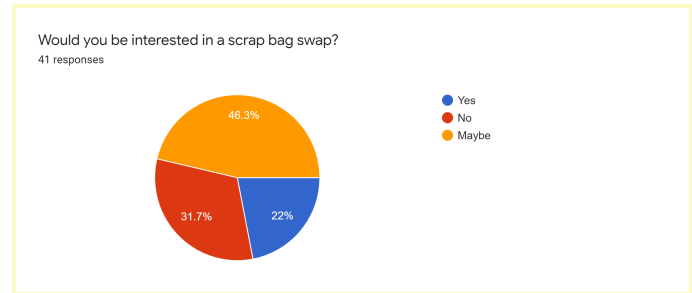
How would you best describe your UFO's?

## Berrien Towne & Country Quilters Guild Meeting via Zoom Minutes

March 11, 2021

Everyone enjoyed a social time as members logged on to Zoom.

The Zoom meeting was called to order at 7:10 PM by Kathy Martus.

The September guild meeting was published in our newsletter. Greta Parker made a motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Tami Wisner. Motion carried.

We are not able to meet at the Church thru April due to the pandemic. The church will let us know on a month by month basis when they will allow us to return. The April guild meeting will be via Zoom. Other groups in our guild can use our Zoom account, contact Barb Manning for details.

The guild will purchase a Zoom subscription for one year. Barb will start Zoom for the April meeting 6:45 giving everyone time to log on and allowing for a bit of social time.

The first 2021 Board meeting the free Zoom was used. Our time ended abruptly without notification. A motion was made by Carol Killian to approve two Board meeting minutes, seconded by Greta Parker. Motion carried.

Jane Rush introduced the 2021 Budget. \$3,000 is needed for fixed costs. If we have 100 members paying \$30 dues our fixed costs are covered. The Board is not asking for any 2021 dues. The Board presented a \$3,257 budget. Motion made by Jennette Cannon, seconded by Jody Albee to approve the budget. Motion carried.

Our Treasurer Lisa Hanson stepped down due to life circumstances. Jody Albee is Co-Treasurer and also has to opt out. Jody will stay on until someone is found to fill the Treasurer position and Marcia McCavit agreed to be a temp co-chair. We

are looking for volunteers for Treasurer and Co-Treasurer.

The Box Factory offers groups an opportunity to exhibit their art. The quilts have to be original designs. If the guild submitted in September we may have a display mid 2022. The Box Factory also has an Art Market where they sell our items for a 30% commission and a \$35 joining fee. If we choose to look into this we would need someone to pick a theme, have people submit items, etc. Julie Kook will talk with Jane about this opportunity for our guild.

Flag Day – Barb Manning has been in communication with the Flag Day committee. They are still not sure if they can have it. We are still exploring the opportunity for a Quilt of Valor presentation. If they are able to have Art in the Park we will consider having a Boutique.

Retreats – The Shipshewana retreat in April is a go with 12 attending the 3 day event. They have room for another person but you need to notify the committee before March 19.

Library – Marilyn Herrman and Linda Woods have volunteered as co-chairs.

There was a survey in the newsletter. Please take a minute to complete. Your response will be anonymous.

Community Quilts – Nancy Hawley has batting and is collecting quilts. Nancy is willing to stay chairman but would like a co-chair. There are a couple people with completed quilts. Nancy would like to take the first 100 quilts to Pine Ridge, after that she will look for a place to donate pediatric quilts.

Show and Tell – several people showed their quilts. Come prepared next month to share your show and tell.

Mystery Quilt – several people spoke about their progress. You can find all the clues on the website.

Website – the website has a new look and has been updated.

A motion was made by Julie Koch and seconded by Jody Albee to adjourn the meeting at 8:08. Motion carried.
